MINISTER'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

As we journey through Lent, and head towards a late Easter this year, I have been reflecting deeply on the discussions and insights of the Lent course which a few of you have joined me on.

Not only have I appreciated the different viewpoints that you bring to those discussions, I have also personally enjoyed revisiting the Gospels individually, and find new things out about the authorship, context, details as well as journeying with Christ through each book's take on such important events for us as Christians.

This new and fresh view of something so familiar to me is also reflected in the events at Easter. The opportunity for new life, celebrated through the events of the empty tomb and disciple's encounters with the Risen Christ show us what God is possible of doing; not just for those disciples and followers in the Gospels, but for us as disciples today.

We can so often forget what is possible when we hand everything over to God, and what is apparent in all the Gospels we so far explored in the course, the disciples also forgot this, and they had Jesus showing them first hand what God could do when your trust was placed in our creator, when following the teaching the Jesus offered, and allowing the Holy Spirit to influence our lives.

As we head towards the tragedy of the Passion in Holy Week, with for us the celebration of the Risen Christ on Easter Day in the back of our minds, perhaps we can relate to those disciples a little more than we did before – reminding ourselves that trusting in God is at the heart of Jesus' message – as much as loving our neighbour as ourselves perhaps?

So however you celebrate Easter this year, I hope it is one that is full of joy, but with an understanding that from that celebration, we can learn a lot about ourselves – and God!

This service will be on our forecourt, weather permitting. If wet, the service will be in the sanctuary. Rain or shine, coffee/tea and hot cross buns will be served in the hall afterwards. A chance for all the people from the churches in the town to meet together and enjoy a time of fellowship.

On Easter Sunday, we meet again at 10.30 am for our

celebration of Easter Day, including a special Easter communion, led by Mrs Mary Ann Jardine.

The fund raising team is busy planning events for us for the summer and is hoping to make full use of our lovely garden – keep ears and eyes open, you won't want to miss anything. Hopefully, our lovely Garden Café will be up and running by the end of May.

I can hear groans from our Saturday coffee teams, but please note that there will be NO forecourt parking from Saturday 3rd May until mid – September because of the normal summer sales.

MUSEUM OF THE MOON

While visiting Exeter Cathedral recently we discovered this amazing representation of the moon suspended in the nave. It is called Museum of the Moon and is an artwork by Luke Jerram created in 2016.

Copies have travelled around the country and all over the world and there are some on permanent exhibition in museums in other countries. It is a helium balloon, 7 metres (23 ft) in diameter. The surface is decorated with printed imagery of the moon's surface from NASA's Lunar Reconnaissance Orbiter at a scale of 1 cm to 5 km. It is lit internally to create a glowing floating orb.

Although the surface is smooth it gives the impression of the lunar landscape's texture. It was amazing to see our light-giving neighbour up close floating above us in the spacious nave. The exhibition was due to end but no doubt it will be popping up somewhere else soon.

FIRE DRILL 9TH MARCH 2025

First a thank you to all who co-operated in the Fire Drill on Sunday 9th March.

There have been discussions for some time in both Elders meeting and Finance & Property meetings regarding the point that on one could remember there ever having been a Fire Drill.

Many if not all of us will remember having Fire Drills both at school and places of employment over the years. Fire drills are done to both allow users to be familiar with procedures and to confirm that the actions taken will work with ideally little or no problems.

All persons in our buildings on 9th March left and were on the forecourt within 5 minuets of the alarm sounding. With some of the congregation having mobility problems this time is not unreasonable.

The outcome of our Fire Drill will be discussed at our next Finance & Property meeting with notes from this referred to Elders for comment.

Please do not expect to wait for 13 years (the time since our Open Door Project rebuild) for our next Fire Drill.

For those who do not have the opportunity to read the House rules and Fire Notes which have recently been displayed at the start of services I've asked for a copy to be included in this copy of the Open Door magazine. It is asked that you please read at least once.


